- Thorp gave an update on our recent staff in-service day were the entire team gathered
 for a full day of learning and training. Trainings included how to handle damaged
 materials when they are returned, Talking Books demo from the Oregon State Library,
 Code Adam procedures to help reunite lost children with their caregivers, the behind
 the scenes reports that are handled each month in order to ensure that patron data
 and catalog data are accurate.
- In process of a part-time Library Assistant recruitment. Working on the recruitment plan to fill two part-time Clerk positions.
- 80+ people attended our Trick or Treat event where each kid in attendance received a free book.
- Library is preparing for World Cup viewing that will show matched during our open hours.
- Girls Who Code program for elementary students of all genders to begin in January.
